Success Rate in bottleneck courses.	Bottleneck-Success Course has a student success rate (C or better) below 85% for a given term. How it is computed: We collect data for each class and average across all classes for % of students getting C- or higher.	
Retention Rates	Undergraduate freshmen 1-year retention refers to the percentage of first-time, full-time undergraduate students who return to the same institution for their second year of study. Transfers (Upper Division) 1-year retention refers to the percentage of transfer students who enter an institution as juniors (upper division) and return for their second year at the same institution. How it is computed: This data is collected/computed by the University Office of <i>Institutional Effectiveness</i>	
Graduation Rates . Undergraduate Program	Graduation rate is the percentage of a cohort of first-time, full-time undergraduate students who complete their degree program within five years. The 4-year graduation rate for upper-division transfer cohorts refers to the percentage of transfer students who enter an institution as juniors (upper division) and complete their bachelor's degree within four years of their initial transfer. How it is computed : This data is collected/computed by the University Office of <i>Institutional Effectiveness</i> .
